WHAT WE DO

Coloma Center is an intensive outpatient mental health treatment program that provides services designed to collaborate with individuals with a serious mental illness (SMI). The program supports individuals who are at risk of or currently involved with the criminal justice system, multiple psychiatric hospitalizations, out of home placement, homelessness or risk of homelessness. Coloma Center is an Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) program that utilizes a multidisciplinary team consisting of licensed marriage and family therapists, social workers, rehabilitation experts, a family care coordinator, youth advocate, peer support specialist, CADC Specialist, nurse, and psychiatrist. After hours on-call support is also offered 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

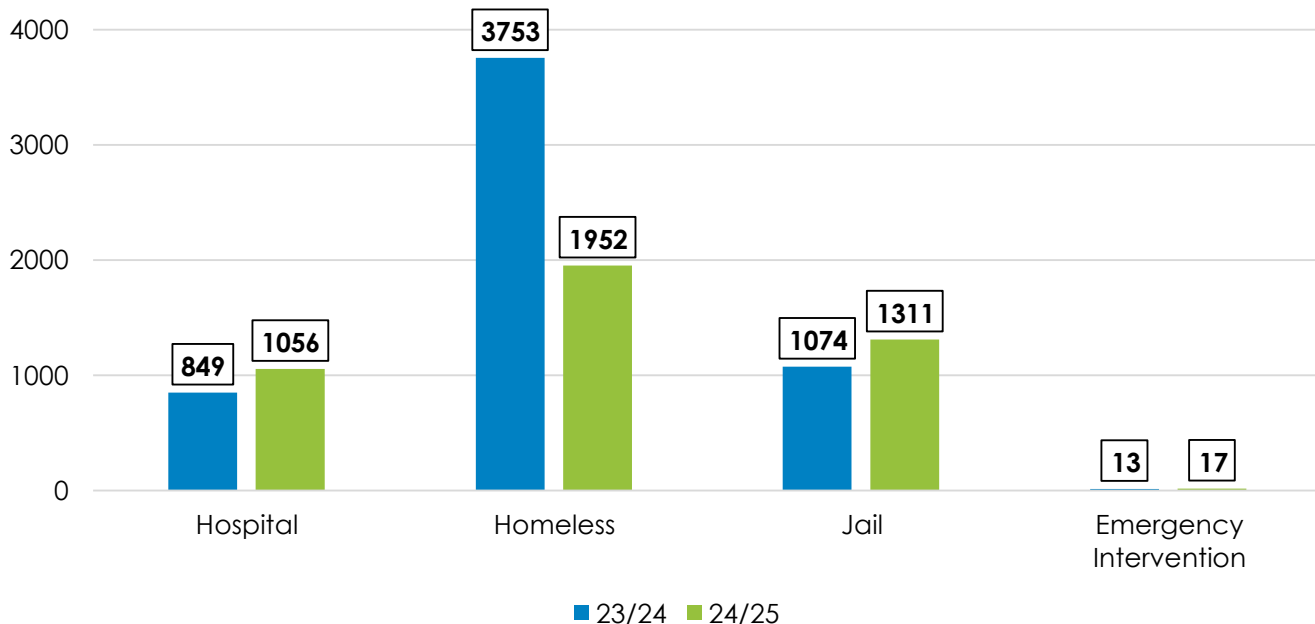

DOMAIN OUTCOMES

A total of 196 individuals were served in the 23/24 fiscal year and 218 individuals were served in the 24/25 fiscal year. The first graphic below is a comparison of all clients served in 23/24 versus all those served in 24/25. The second graphic compares only those individuals served in the 23/24 fiscal year who continued to be served in the 24/25 fiscal year (n=104).

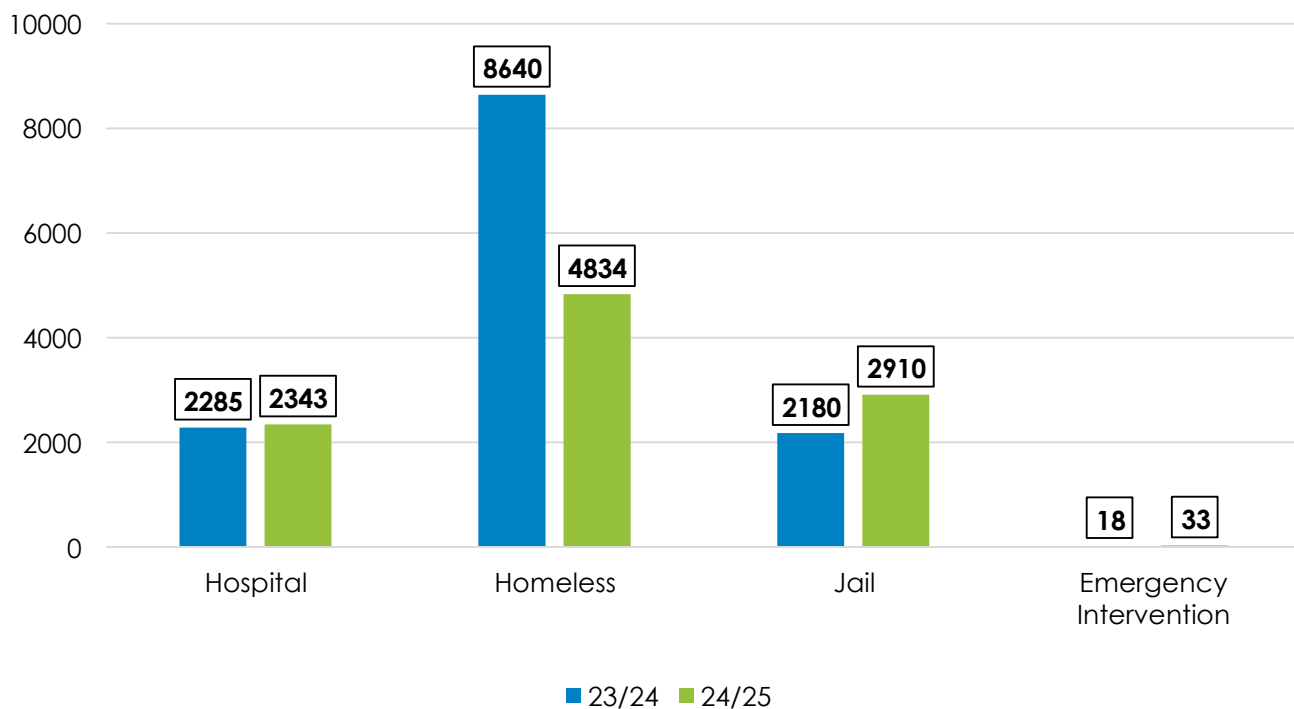
23/24 vs 24/25 Fiscal Year (FY)

All Clients Served



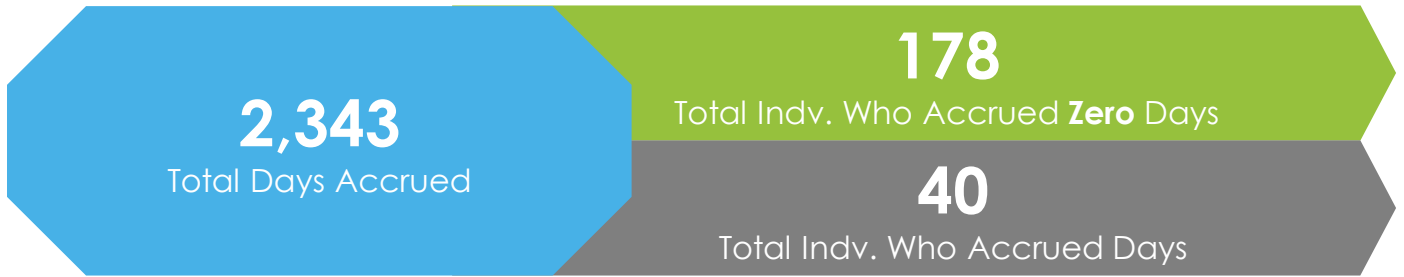
23/24 vs 24/25 Fiscal Year (FY)

104 Clients Served BOTH Fiscal Years

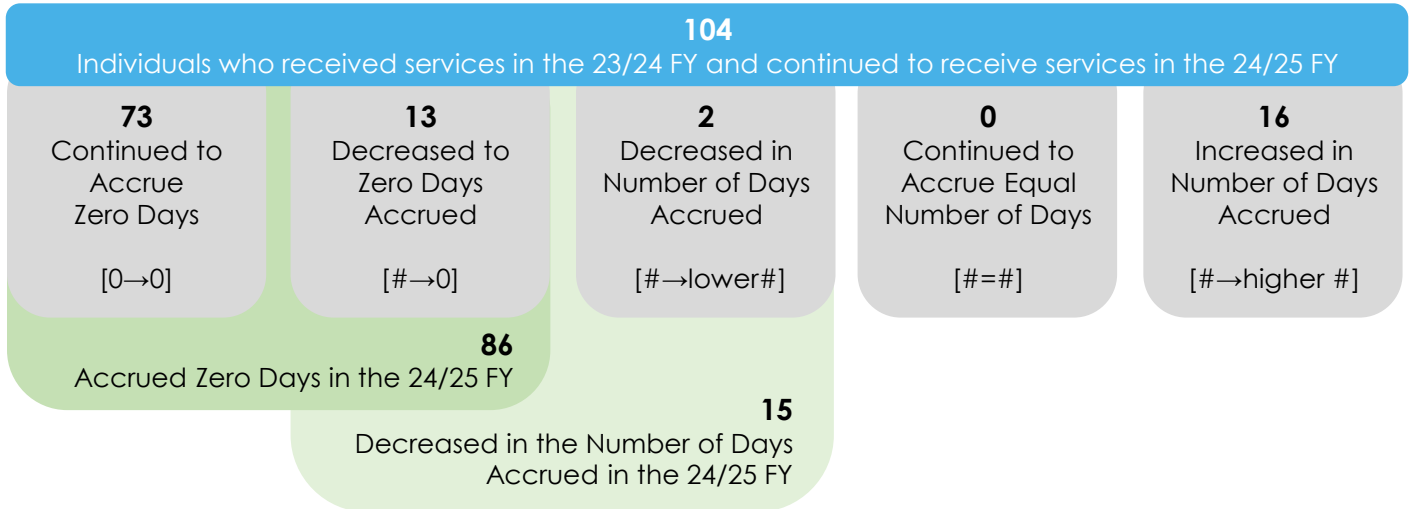


PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITAL DAYS

All Clients Served in the 24/25 FY

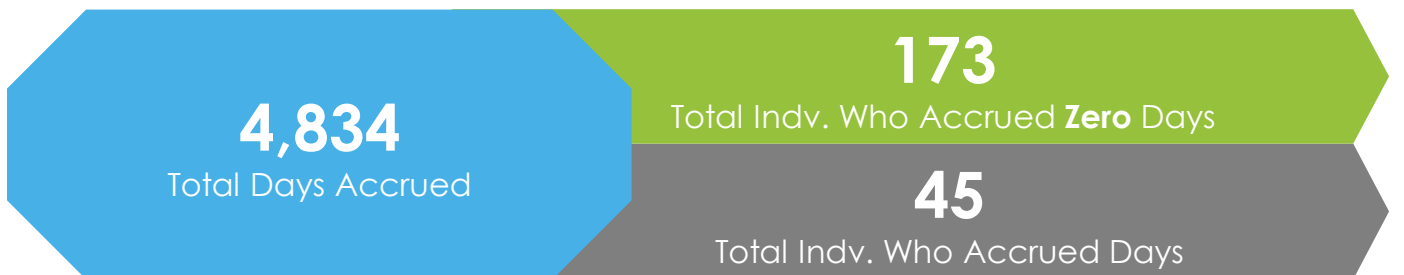


Pre/Post Comparisons of Individuals Served Both FYs

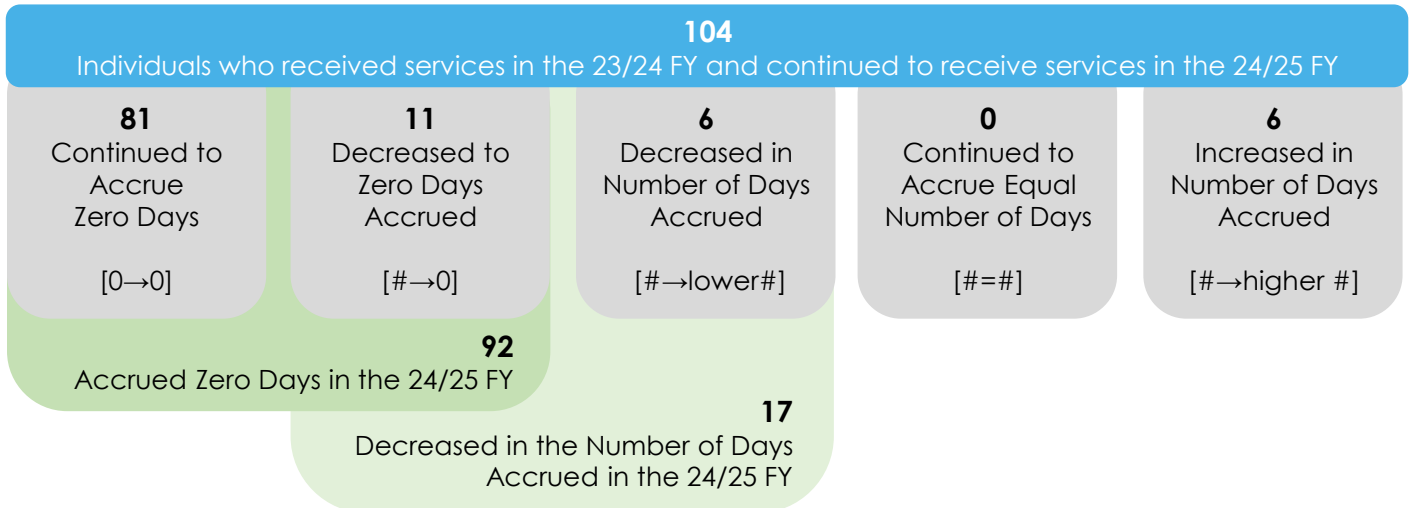


HOMELESS DAYS

All Clients Served in the 24/25 FY

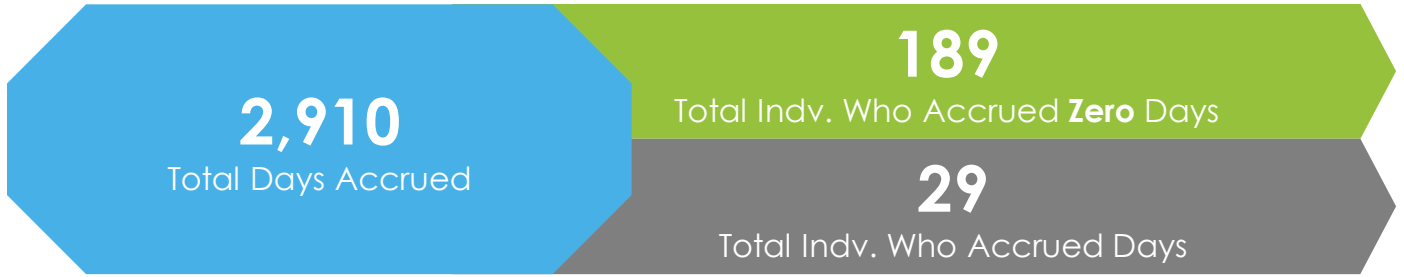


Pre/Post Comparisons of Individuals Served Both FYs

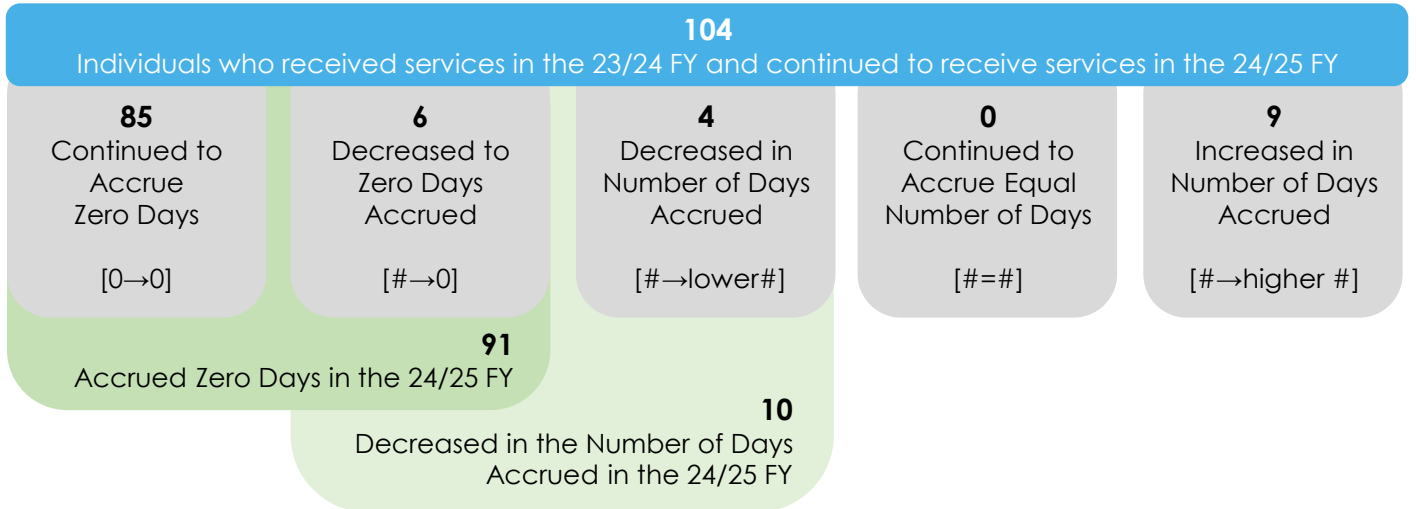


JAIL DAYS

All Clients Served in the 24/25 FY

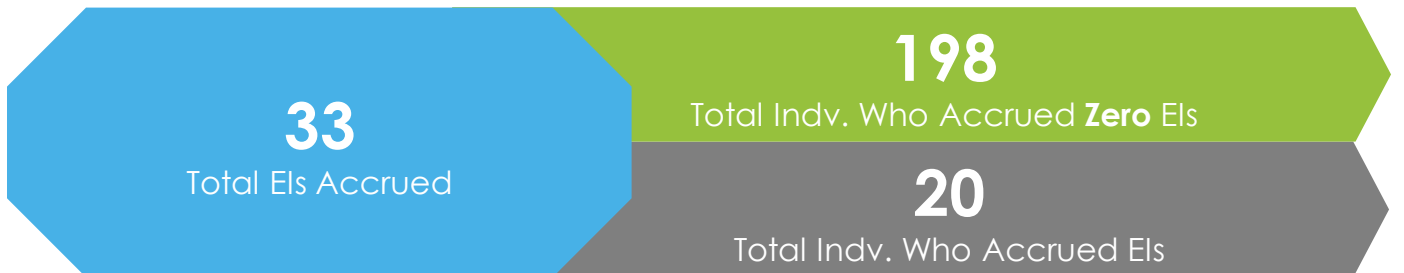


Pre/Post Comparisons of Individuals Served Both FYs

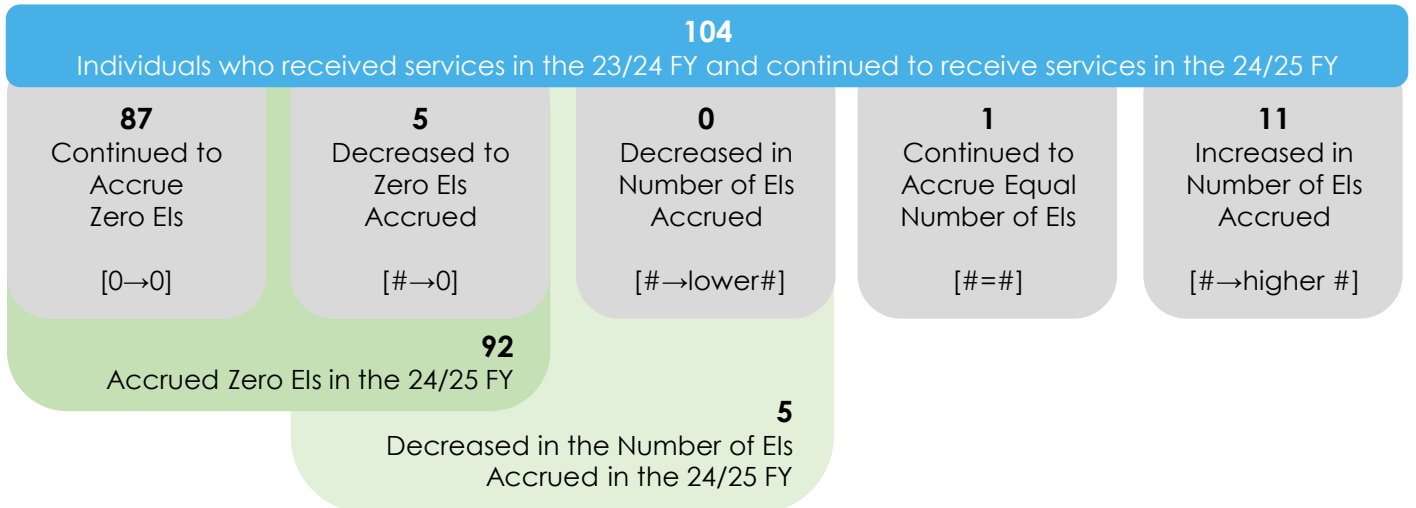


EMERGENCY INTERVENTIONS (EIs)

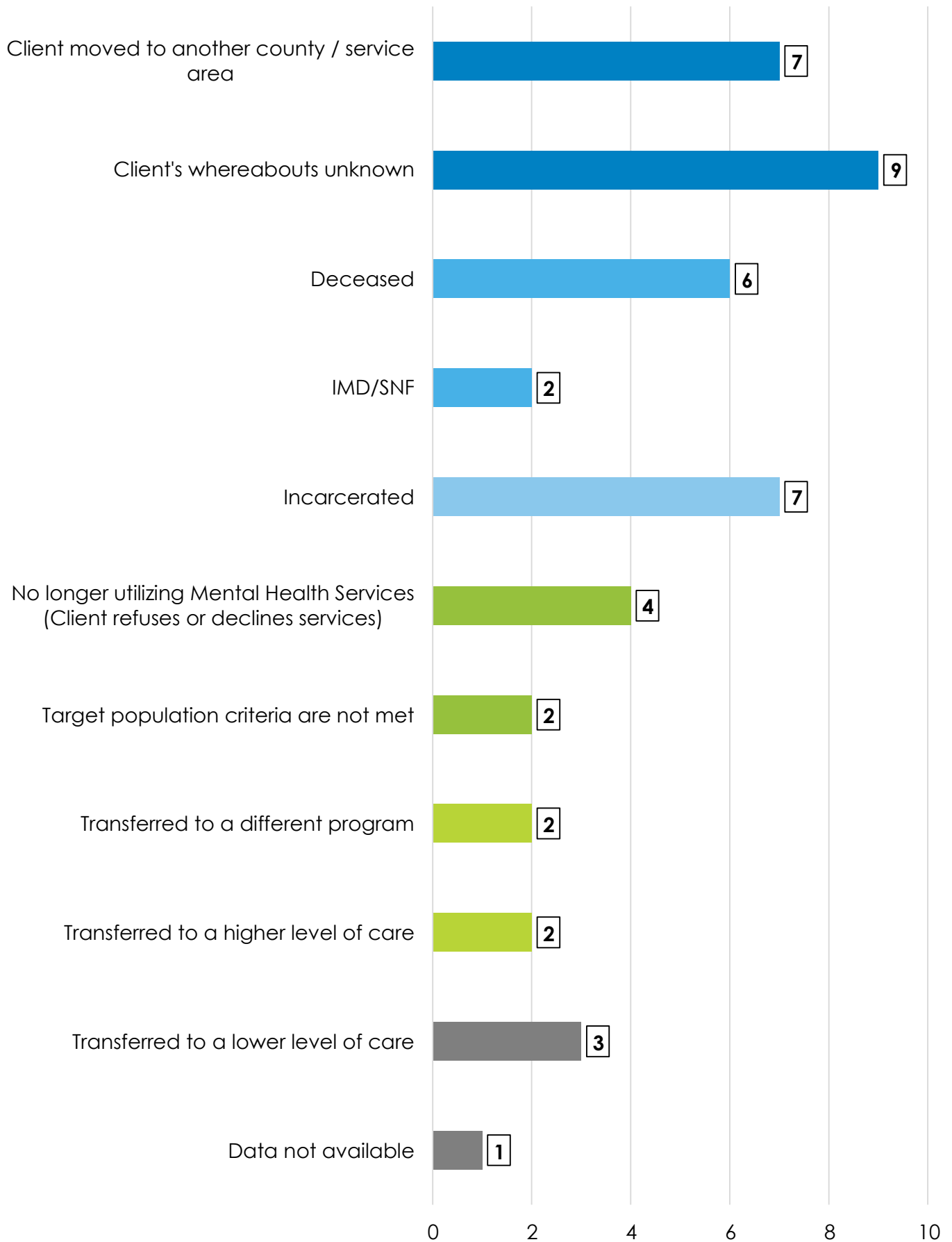
All Clients Served in the 24/25 FY
