WHAT WE DO

Chico Housing offers a two-pronged approach in supporting the housing needs of adults in Butte County. The first service offered is a Permanent Supportive Housing Program (PSHP) for adults with both a developmental disability and a psychiatric disorder. PSHP clients are provided Transitional Support Services (TSS-Chico) wrap-around services to support them in obtaining and maintaining permanent housing. The second service offered is the availability of two Crisis Beds (CB) for individuals in need of safe, supportive, temporary short-term housing.

Individuals utilizing either PSHP or CB services are provided 24-hour staff to assist in creating an environment that strives to teach each individual skills needed to successfully live as independently as possible.

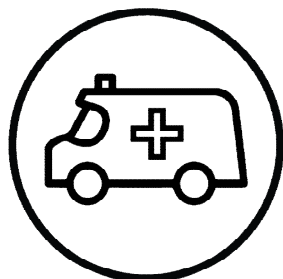

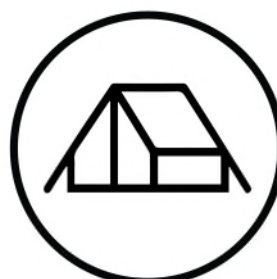
